A short list of premeditated government actions across three countries to enforce white supremacy. Plus one modern day link.

<a href="#">Slave reparations were paid to British slave owners</a>	A staggering <i>40 per cent of the British Treasury's annual spending budget</i> was paid out to slaveowners in 1833 as part of abolishing slavery in the colonies.
<a href="#">Central Park was built on top of thriving black settlement named Seneca Village</a>	"An entire Manhattan village owned by black people was destroyed to build Central Park" "By the time it was finally razed in 1857...Seneca Village probably had a more radical purpose, too, as a stop on the Underground Railroad"
<a href="#">Jack Johnson boxing's "race war" world title fight in Australia 1908</a>	"But in the 14th round it looked so grim for the [Canadian] white man that a knockout seemed certain and the police... <i>following a preconceived plan...</i> stopped the movie cameras"
<a href="#">WW1 Victory Parade in 1919, no American blacks allowed</a>	France had a WW1 victory parade on Bastille day July 14, 1919. All the French allies were to attend. America sent troops except... "The slights went on and on. Black troops were not allowed to march in the victory parade in Paris."
<a href="#">WW2 Liberation Of Paris -- no blacks of any country allowed!</a>	This time America told the other Allies that <i>they too</i> weren't allowed to have any black troops, too! The British and French complied. The American memo is in the British archives.
<a href="#">In 1965 the city of Charlottesville demolished a thriving black neighbourhood</a>	"The razing of Vinegar Hill [Charlottesville's largest black neighbourhood] displaced families and dissolved the community" "Despite all the talk about better stores and new apartment buildings...the land remained empty for years. The children who lived there would visit the empty lots where their houses used to be."
<a href="#">UWI Vice-Chancellor says colonial powers left the Caribbean in a mess and development reparations are needed</a>	"More amputations are committed in the Caribbean per capita than any other part o the world. For 300 years the people of this region were forced to consume a diet based on what we produced, sugar...If we take the marker of chronic diseases, the black people in the Caribbean are the sickest in the world on a per capital basis, this is a direct consequence and legacy of slavery and colonisation," he said
